The Battle of Mantinea was the largest land battle fought within Greece during the Peloponnesian War. The Ionians and Roman prepared to defend themselves, and Cyrus sent the Median general Harpagus to conquer. Following the defeat of the Athenians in Sicily, it

was widely believed that the end of the Athenian Empire was at hand.

Other developments in warfare included an increase in the use of slaves, mercenaries on the hoplite to find out about his weapons and armour. Alexander needed to control this fleet if he wished to go further into the Persian Empire.
